

**Section A: Conjunctions in Context**

1. Any sentence correctly using two different conjunctions, e.g. "I like tea and coffee, but not hot chocolate."
2. "And" simply adds information; "but" shows a contrast or difference between the two ideas
3. e.g. "The dog barked, and the cat ran away, which was funny."
4. "Because" - it shows a reason
5. e.g. "Although it was raining, we played outside" - this only makes sense with a contrast word like "although"

Section B: Punctuation Reasoning

1. "Its" shows something belongs to "it" (no apostrophe); "It's" is short for "it is" (with apostrophe)
2. "Sarah asked, \"Can we go to the park?\""
3. An apostrophe shows ownership by adding 's to a name or noun, e.g. "Tom's bike" shows the bike belongs to Tom
4. "An" is used before words starting with a vowel sound
5. Any three correctly punctuated sentences on the same topic
