

**Section A: Fronted Adverbials & Paragraphs**

1. Any two sentences, one with a time fronted adverbial (e.g. "Later that day...") and one with a place fronted adverbial (e.g. "By the river...")
2. A comma separates the fronted adverbial from the rest of the sentence, making it clearer to read
3. e.g. "Later that afternoon, we went to the beach. It was sunny."
4. e.g. "To signal a change of scene, time, or topic to the reader"
5. Any short paragraph correctly using a fronted adverbial

**Section B: Apostrophes & Precision**

1. "The dogs' bones" means the bones belong to more than one dog; "the dog's bones" means they belong to one dog
2. "The girl's books were on the table."
3. e.g. "The children's books were on the table."
4. e.g. "the tall, crumbling, ancient castle"
5. Because the extra description gives the reader a much clearer, more vivid picture of the tree
